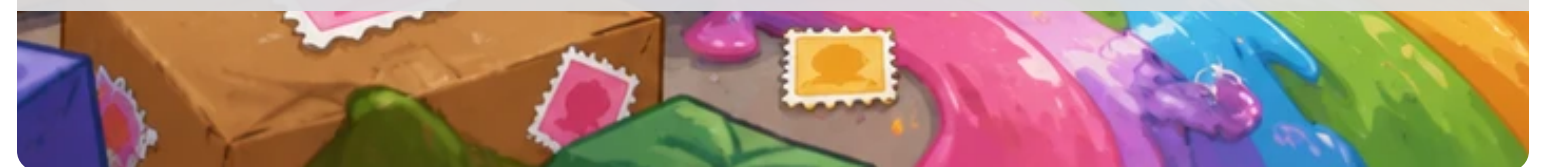




Penny's Parcel Pandemonium
