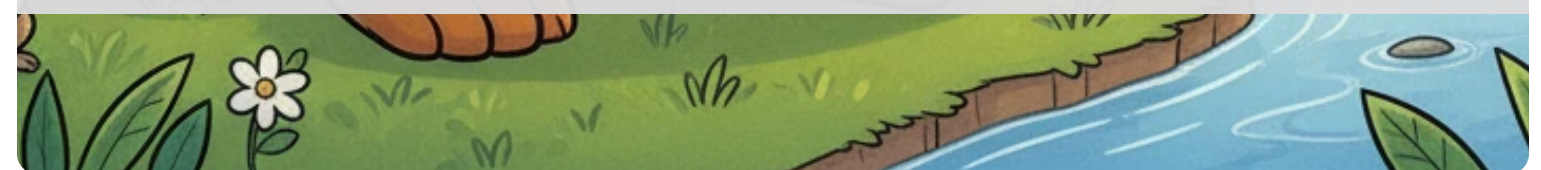




Barnaby the Benevolent Bear and the Sunny Forest's Caring Heart
