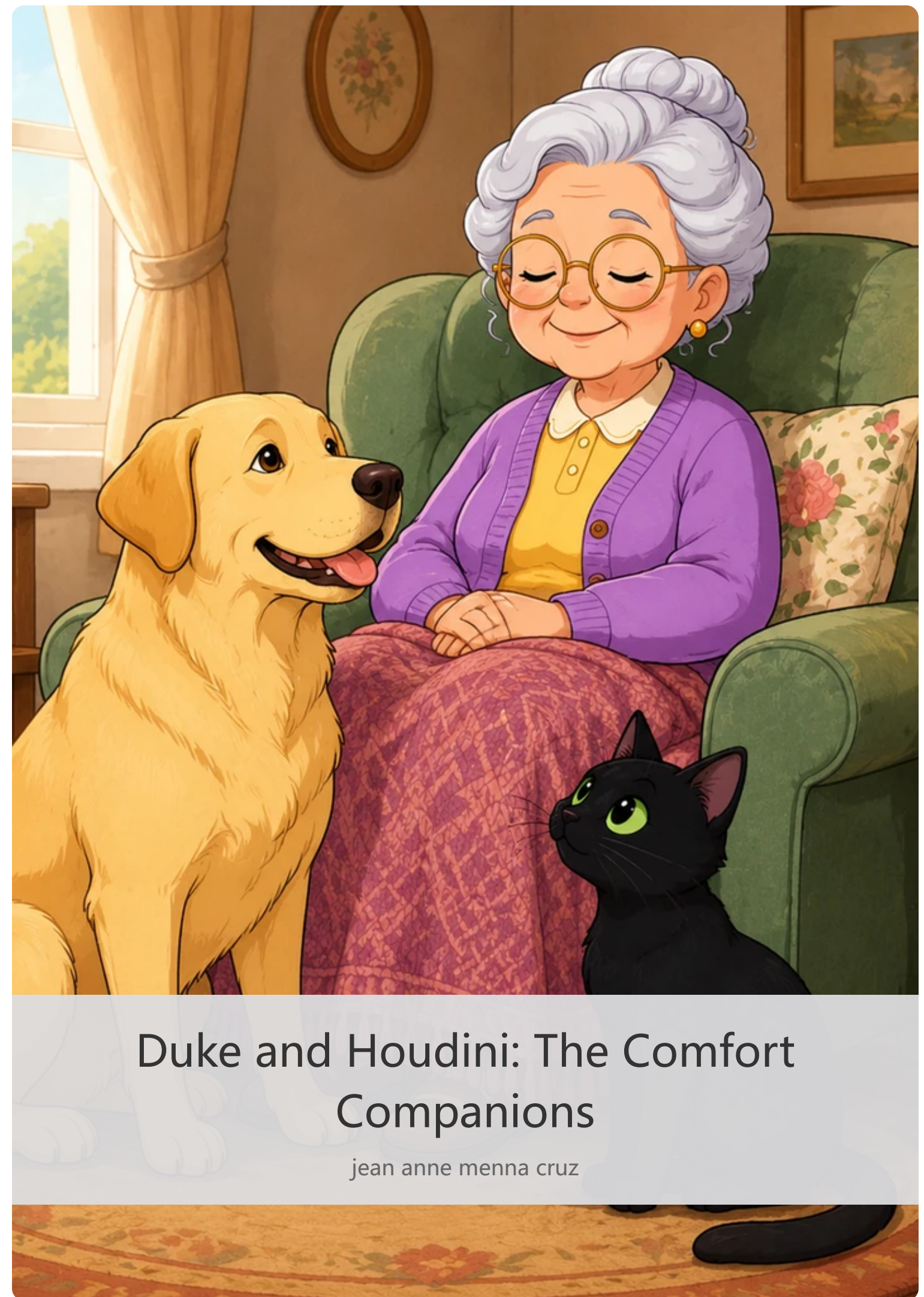




Duke and Houdini: The Comfort Companions
