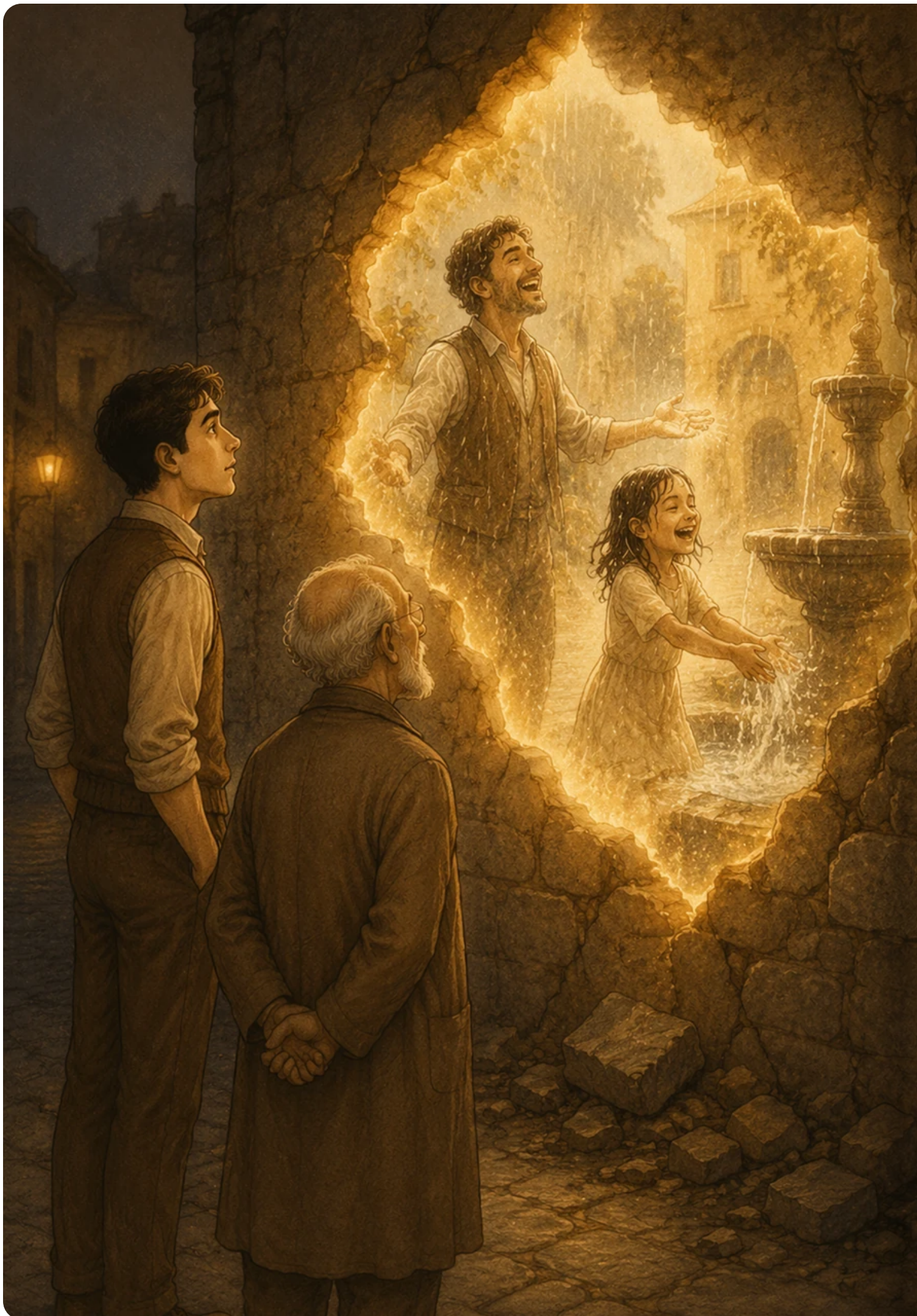


Aurelia: The City That Remembers

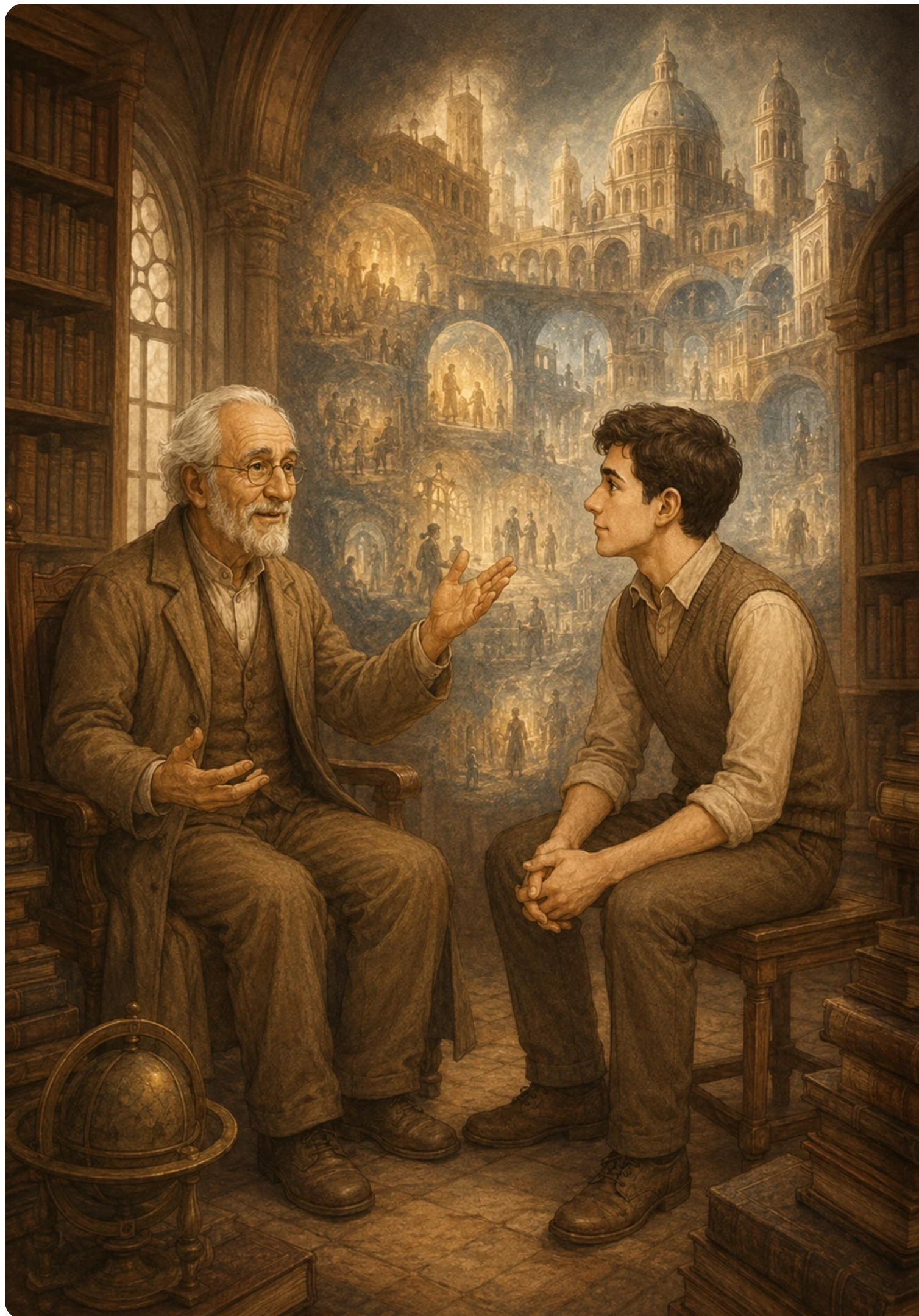
