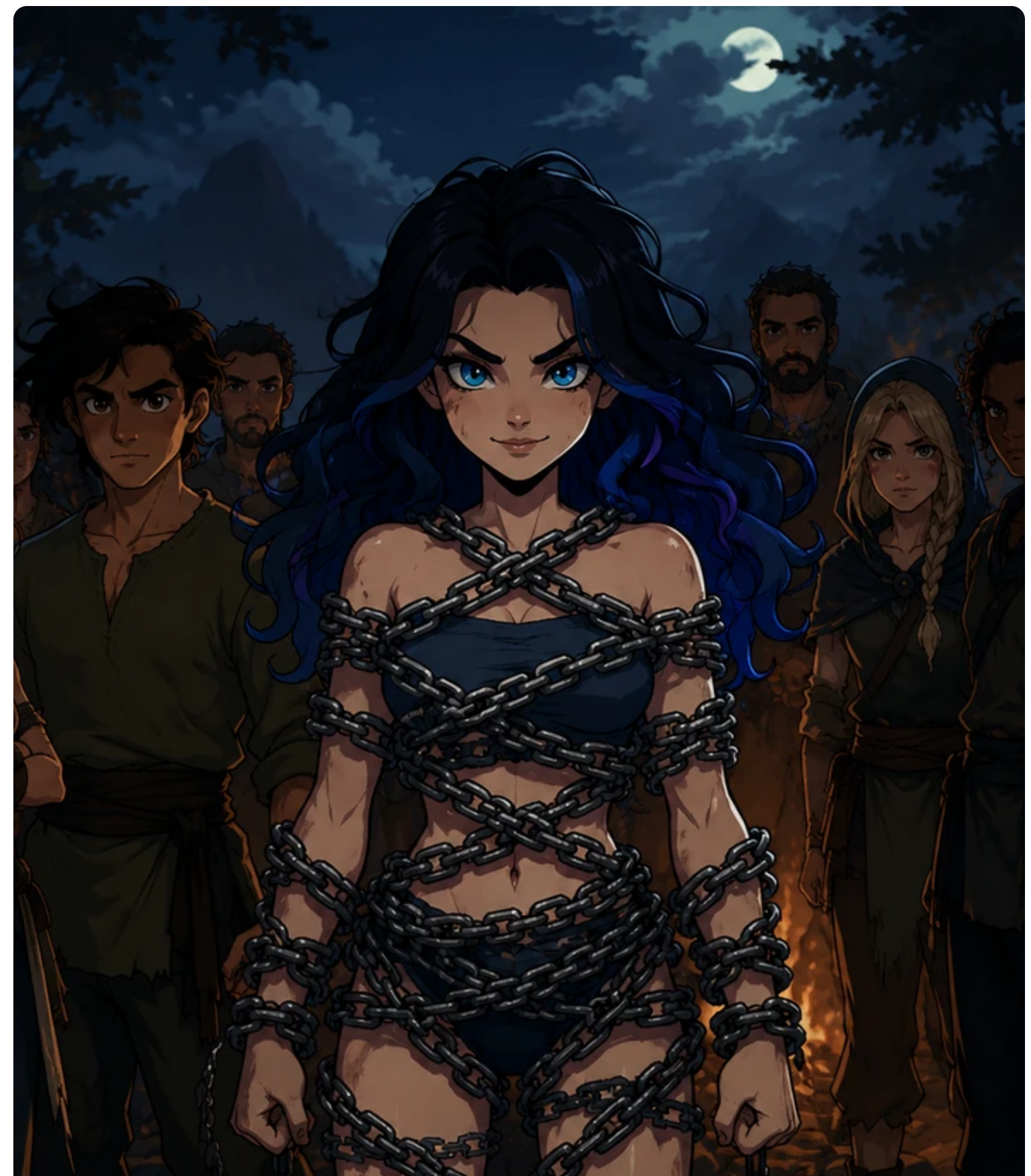




The Whispering Embers

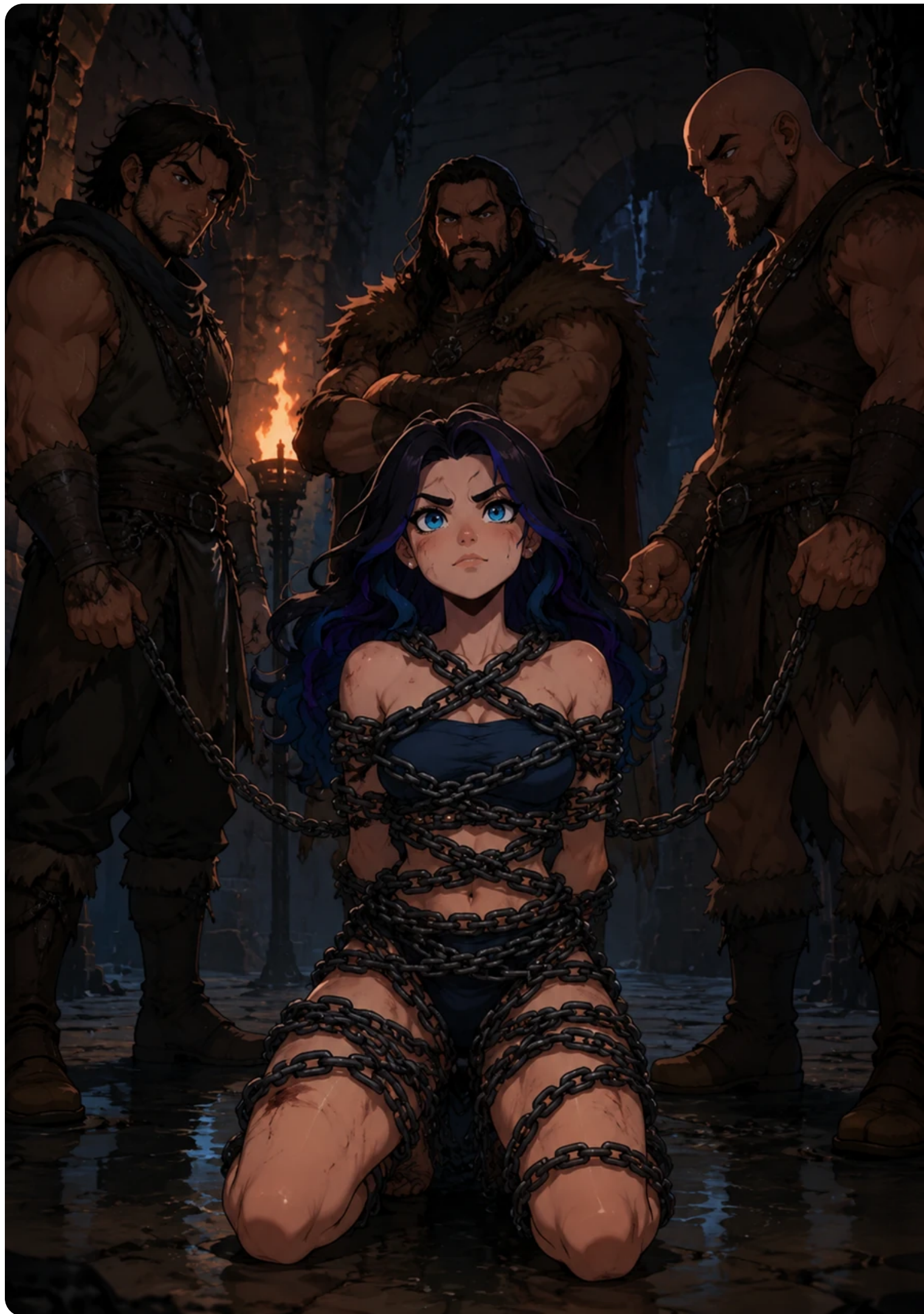
