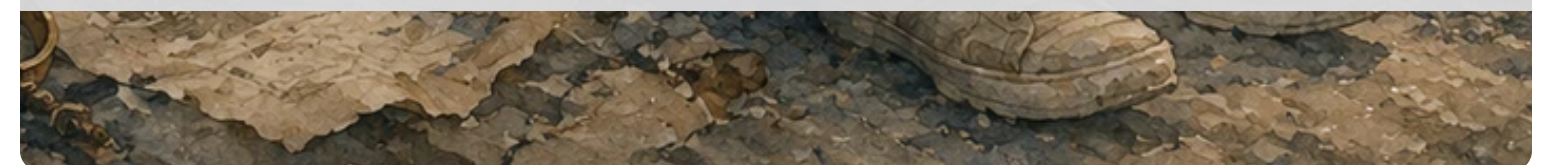




# The Captain of the Shipwreck
