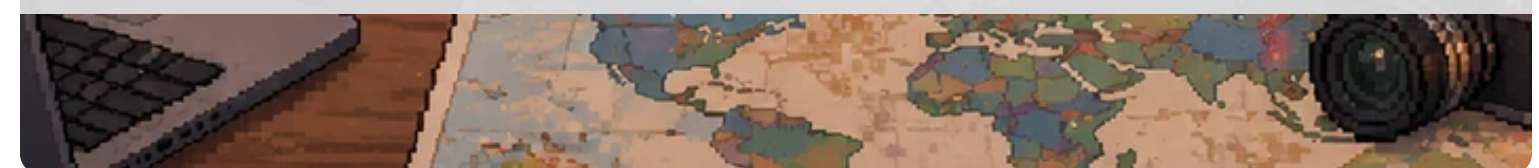




The Beginning of Home
