Leo's Passport of Discovery

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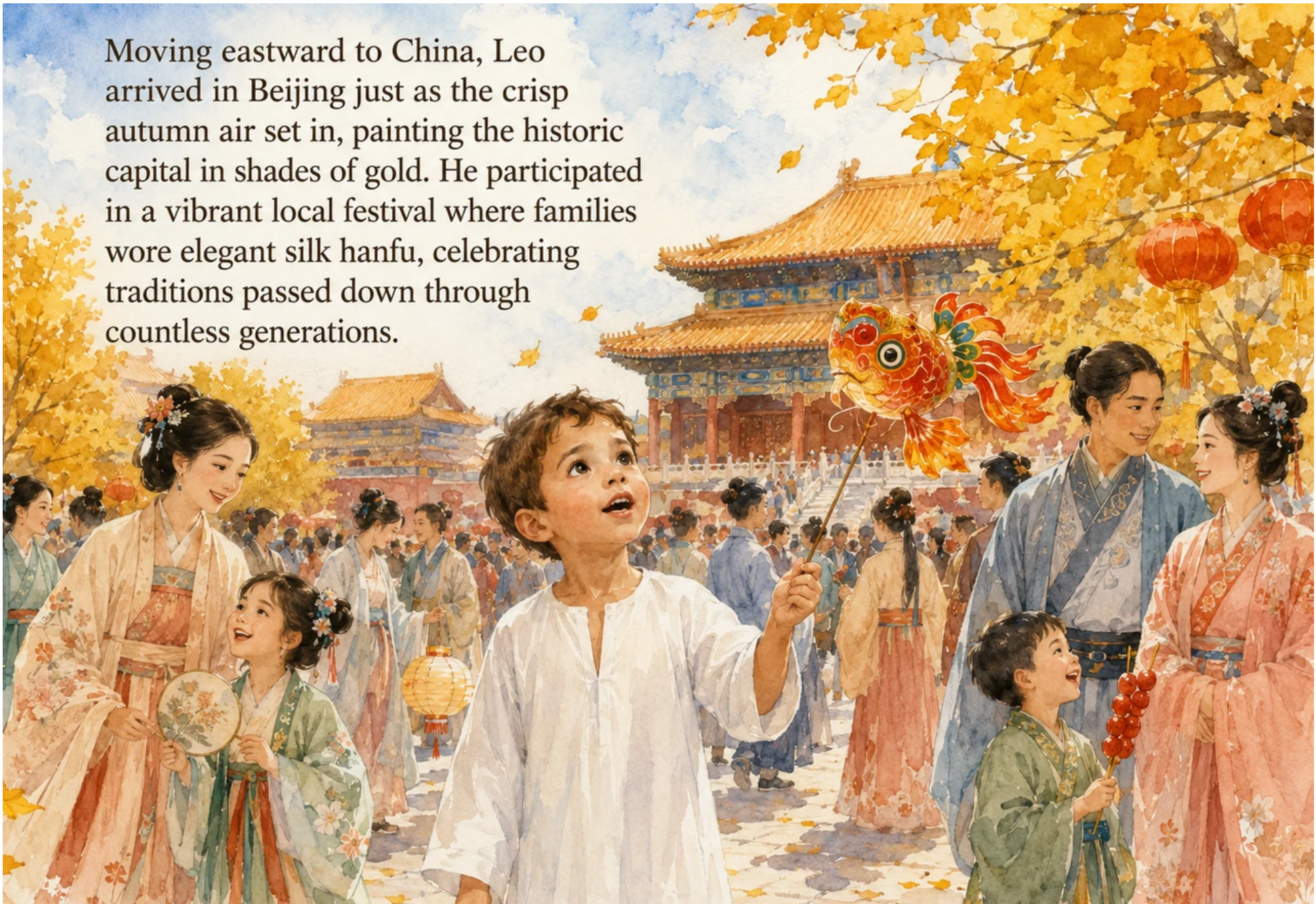

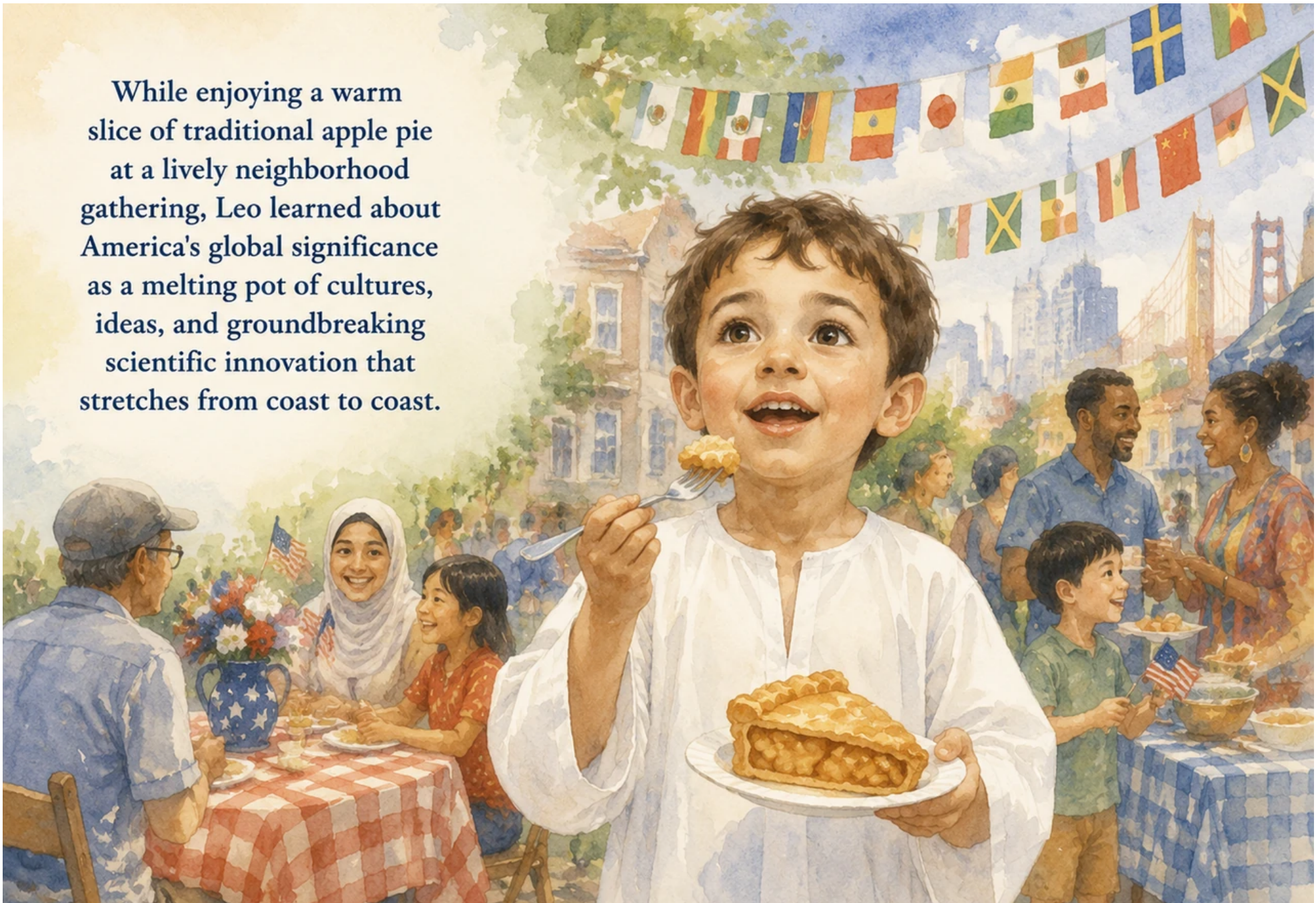
In a bustling Roman piazza,

influence global culture today.



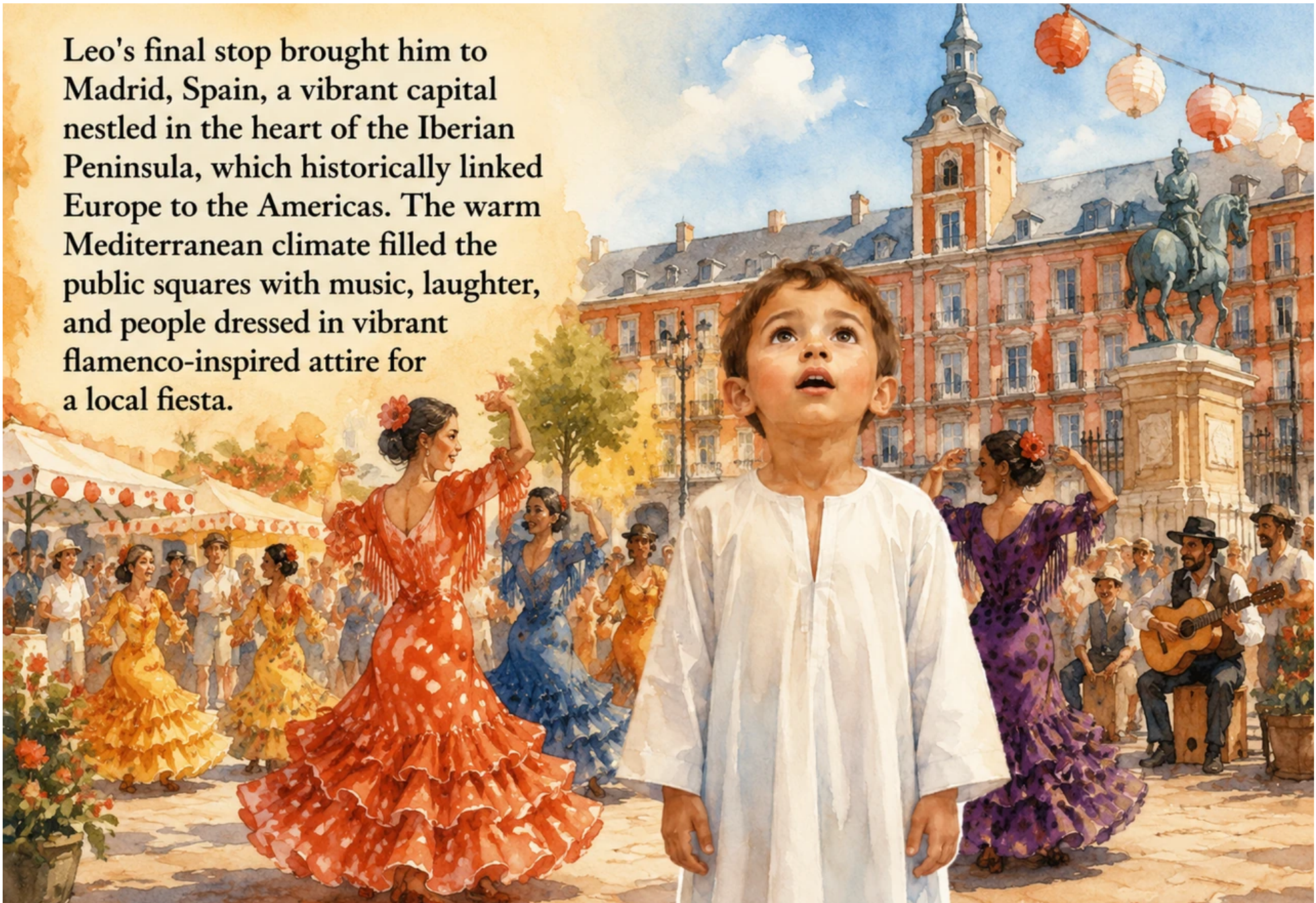
