$$(X) = 5$$



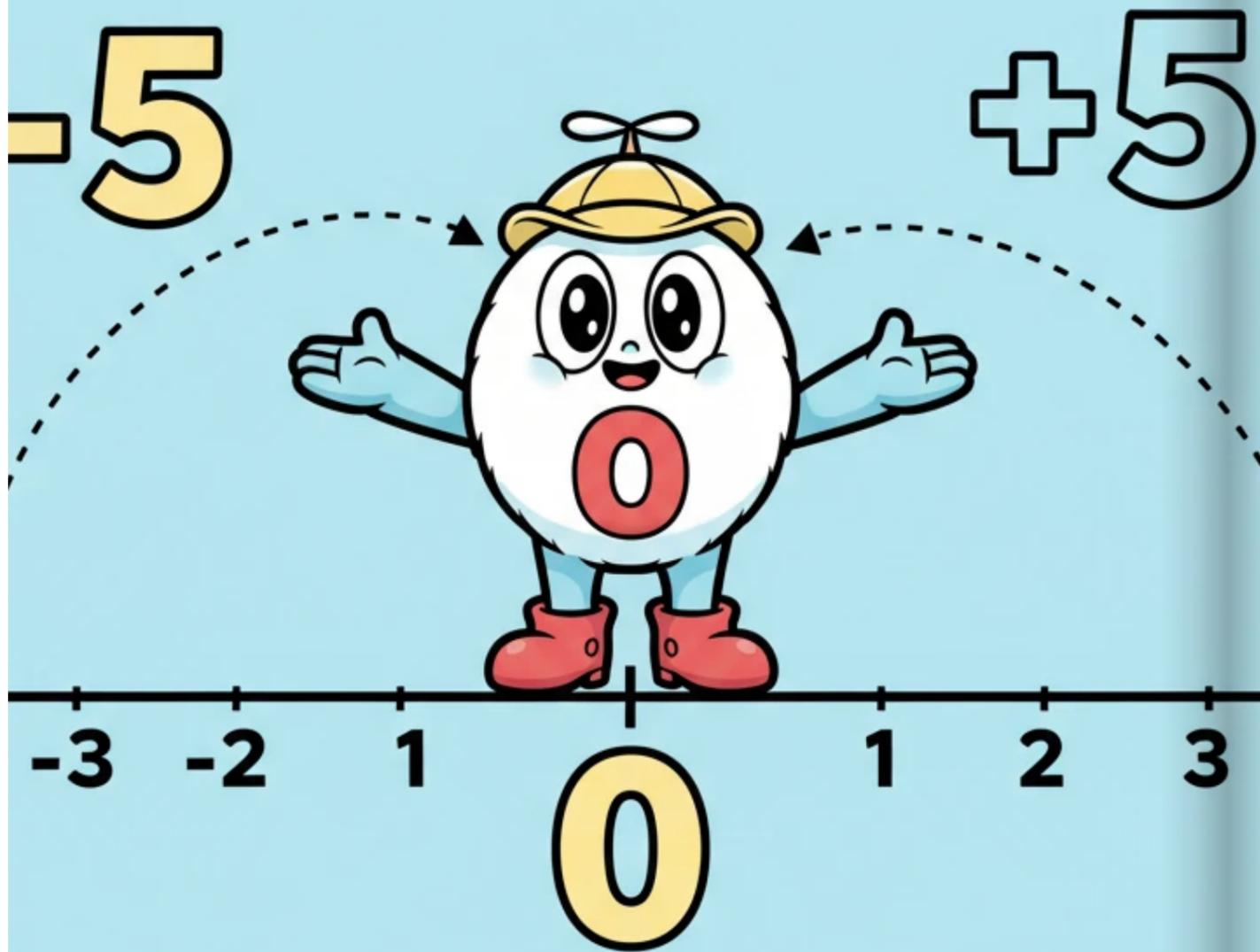
