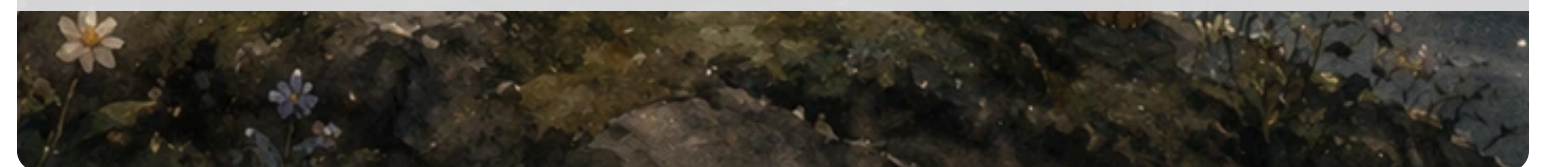




Mira and the Secret of Moonwhistle Forest
