



Professor Pip's Wondrous English Class

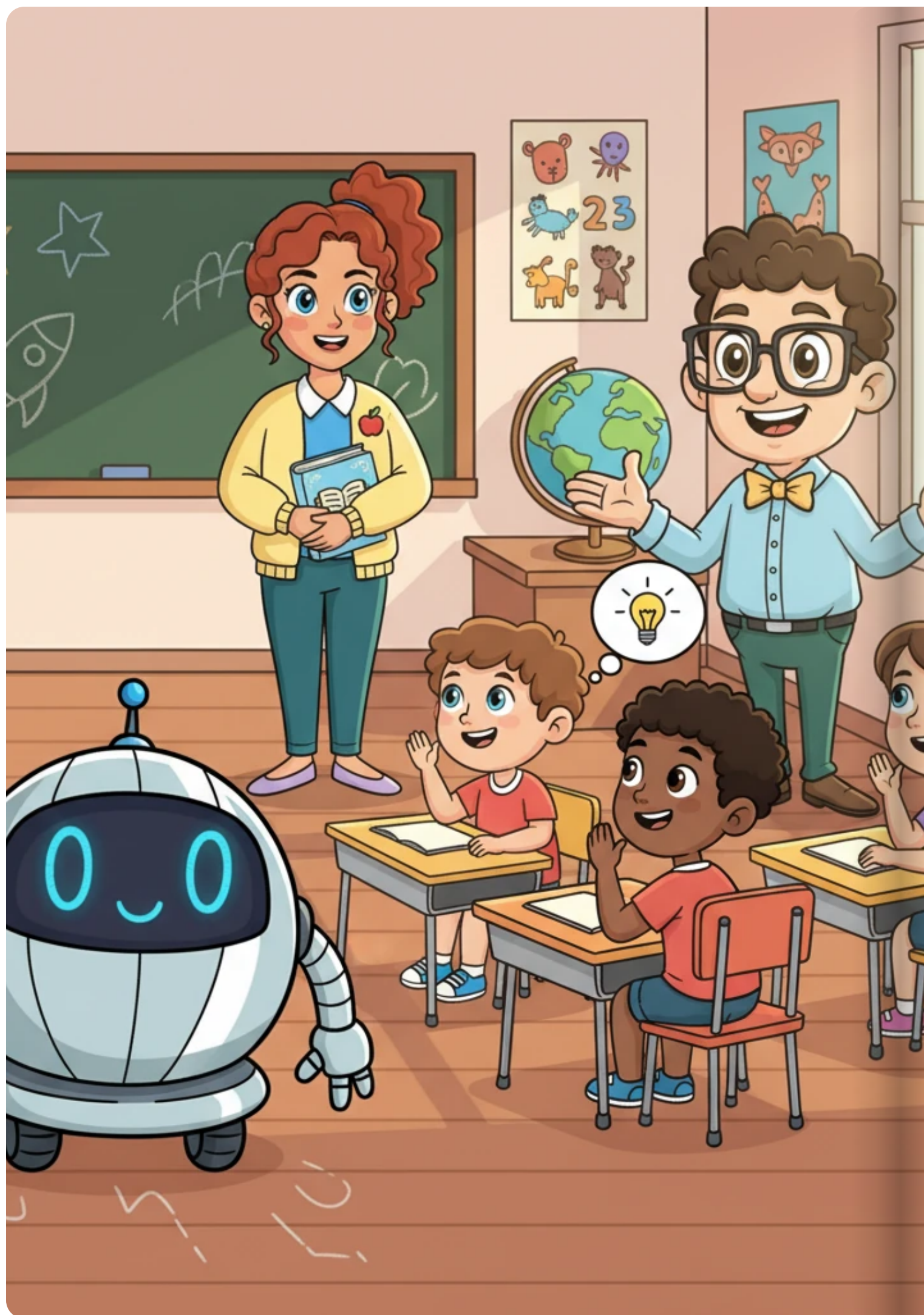
