



A Facto for Flor: Moving On and Living Best

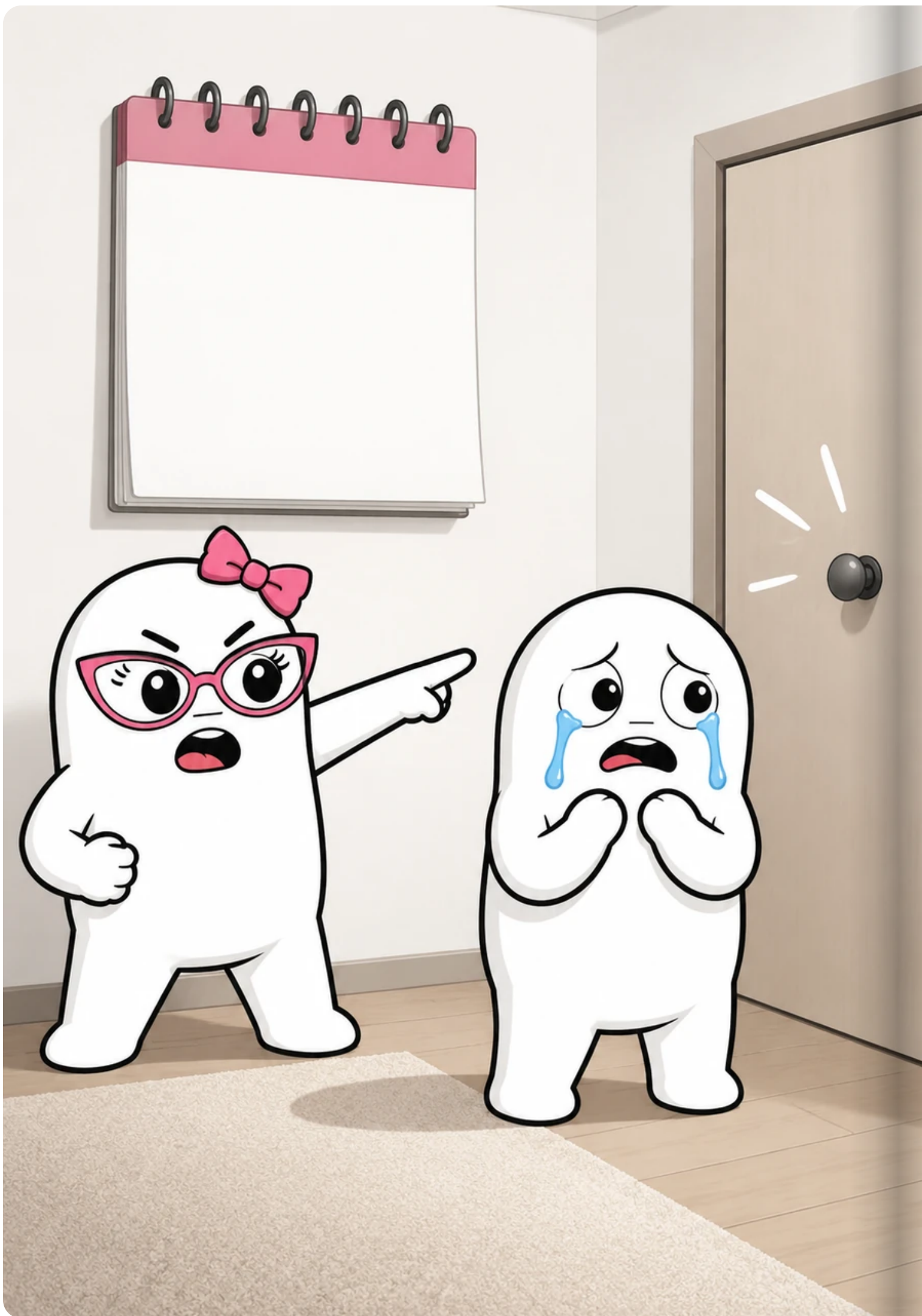

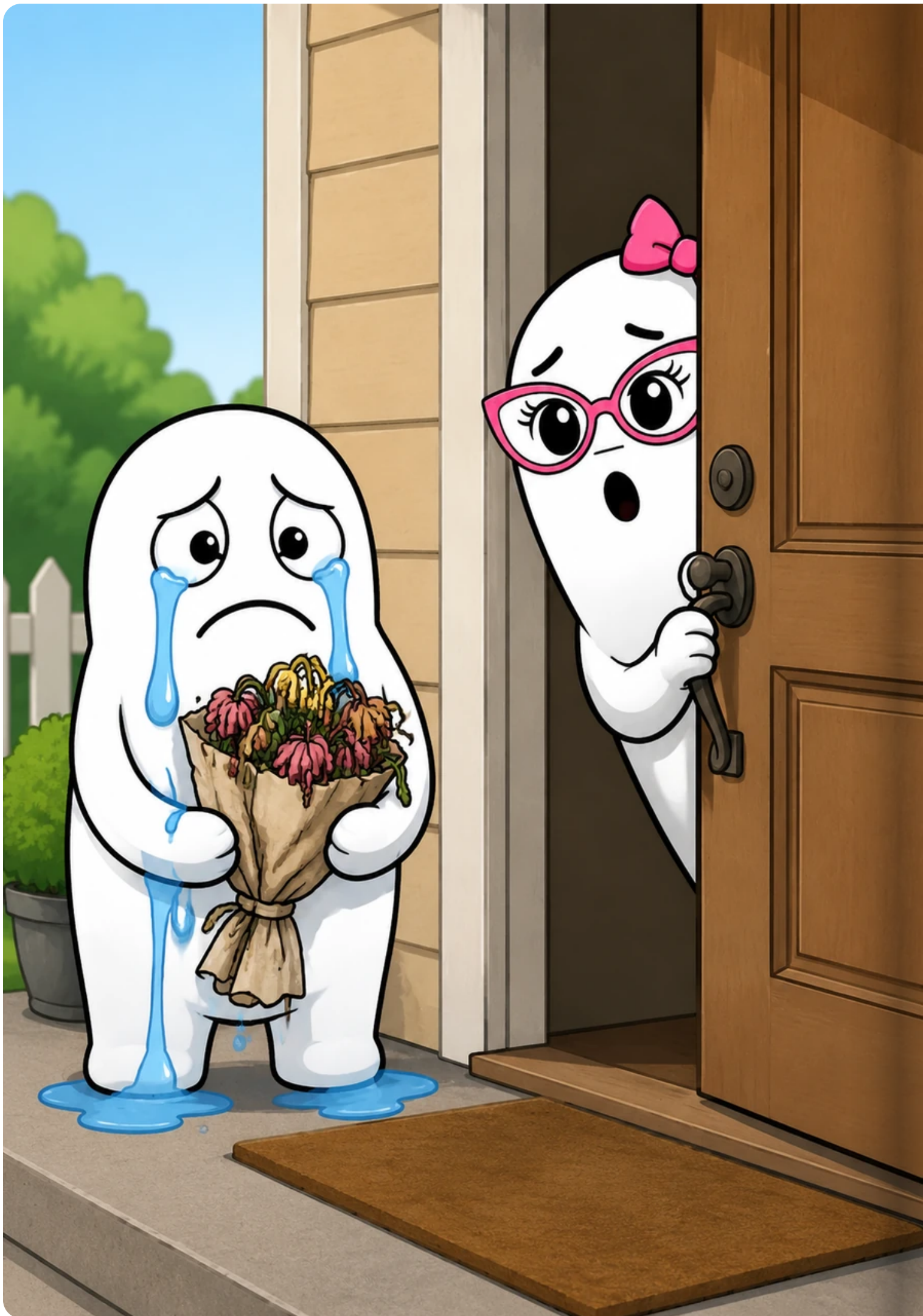
