



# Kaito's Great Gakuen Art Adventure

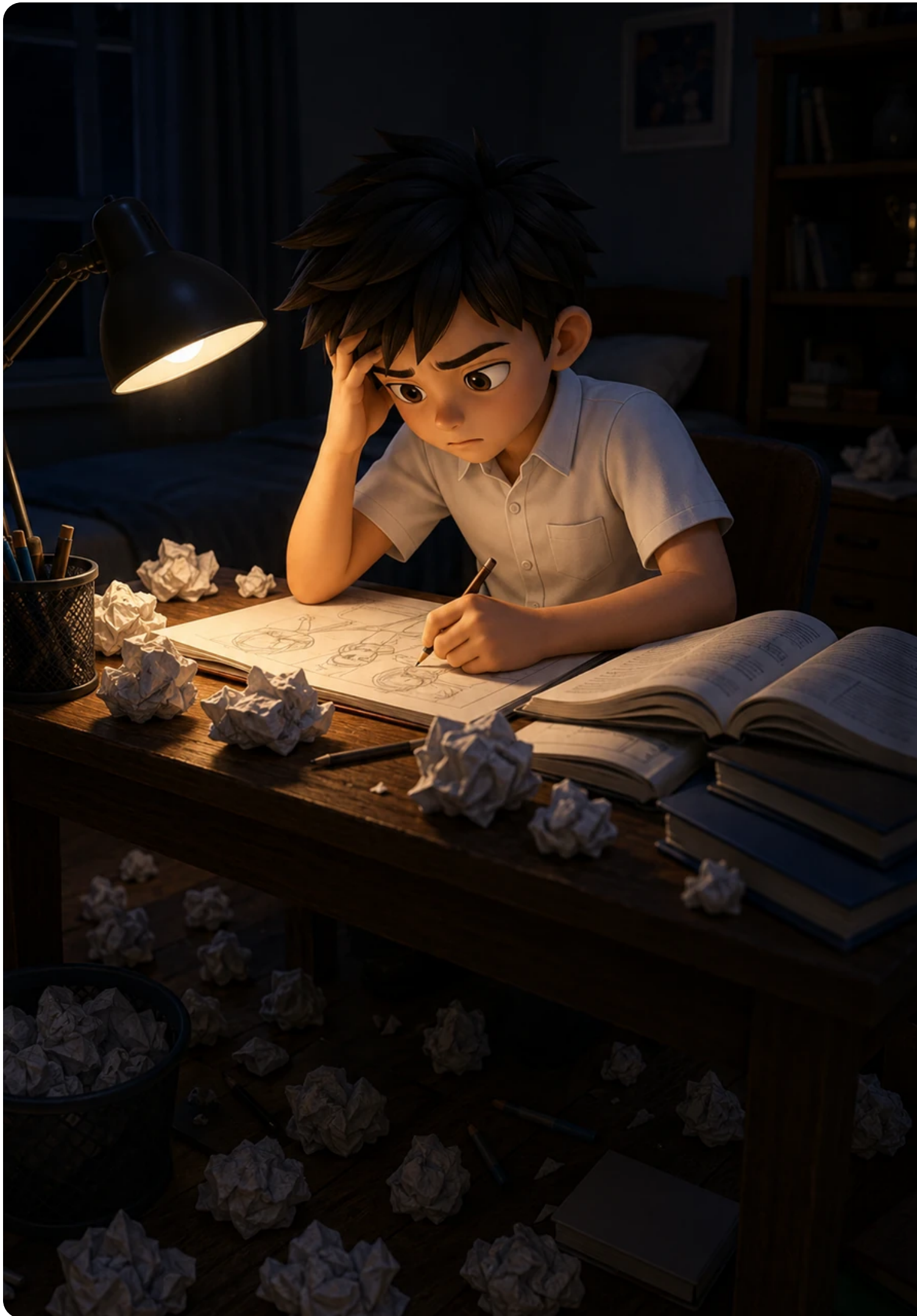
