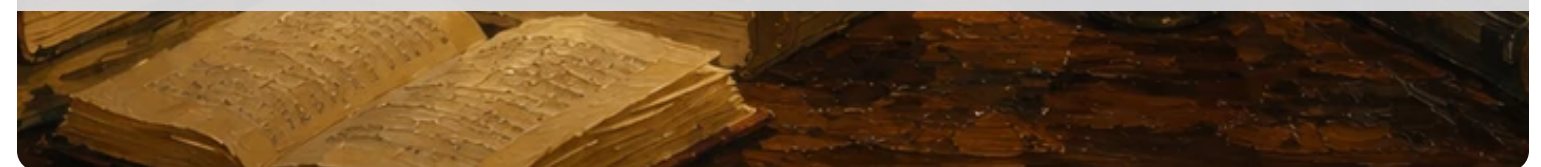




# A Day Offline
