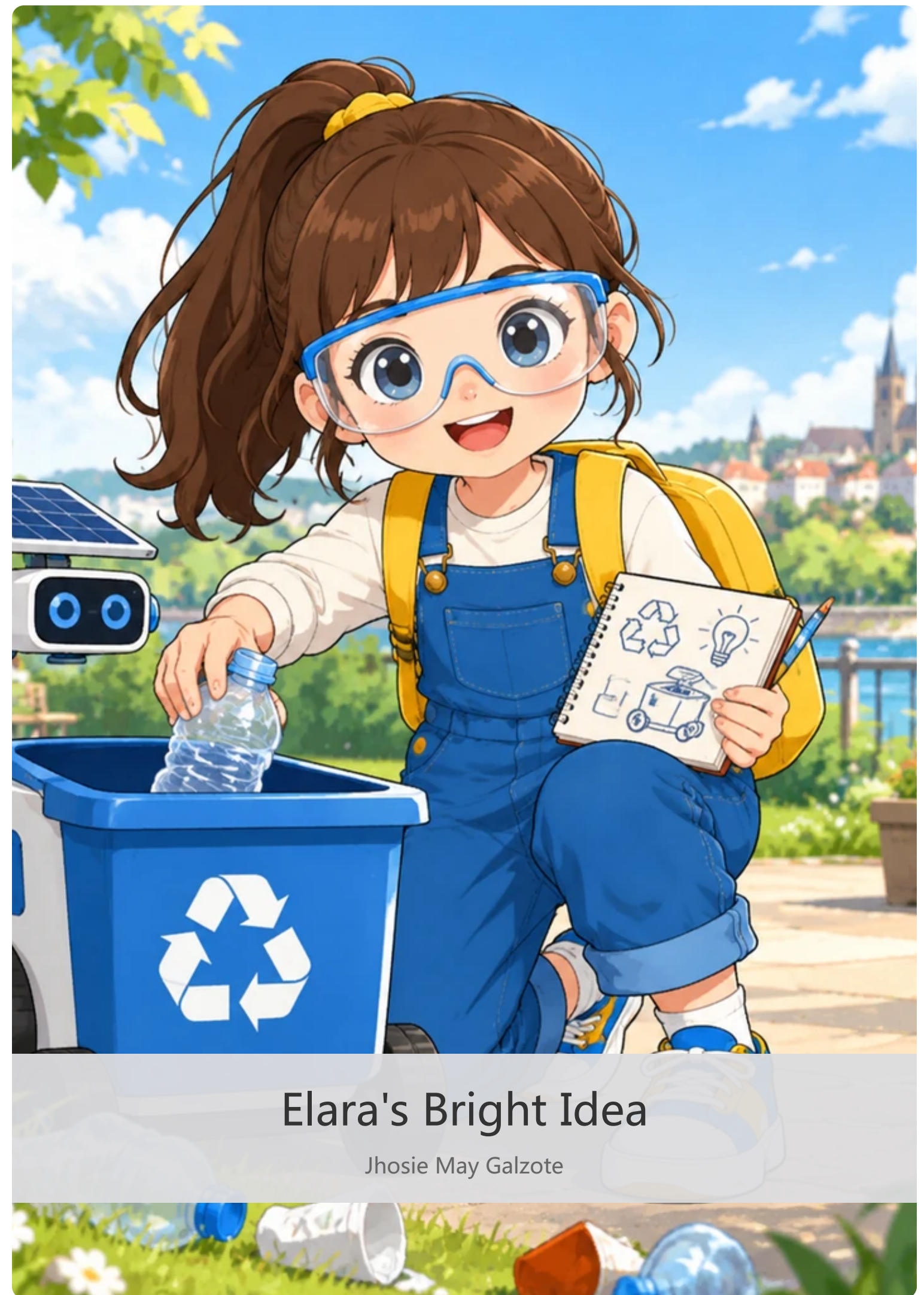




Elara's Bright Idea
