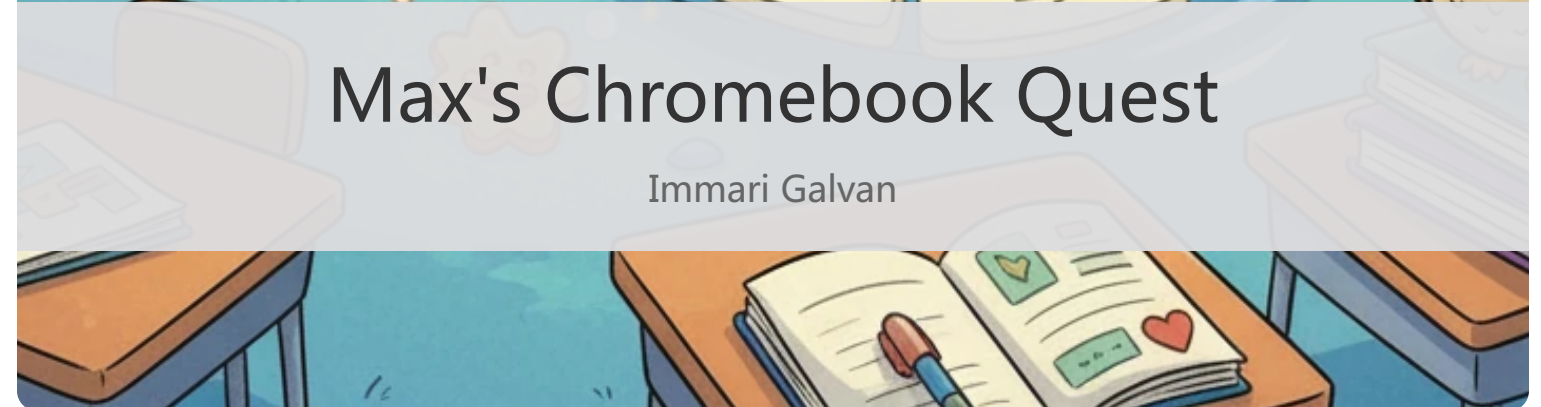




Max's Chromebook Quest
