

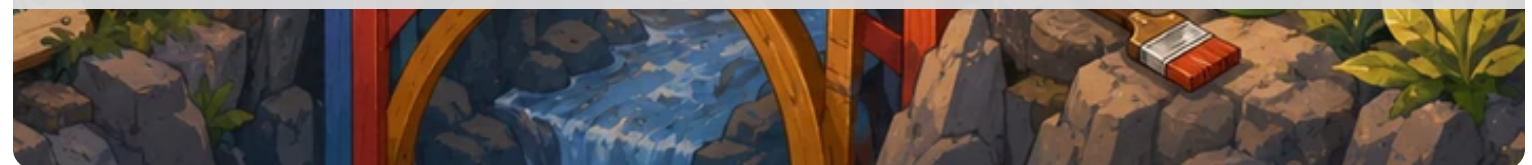
# BRIDGE OF ALL PATHS
