Fatima saw a vision of a storm brewing, its fierce winds threatening to uproot the ancient baobab tree and damage the homes nearby.



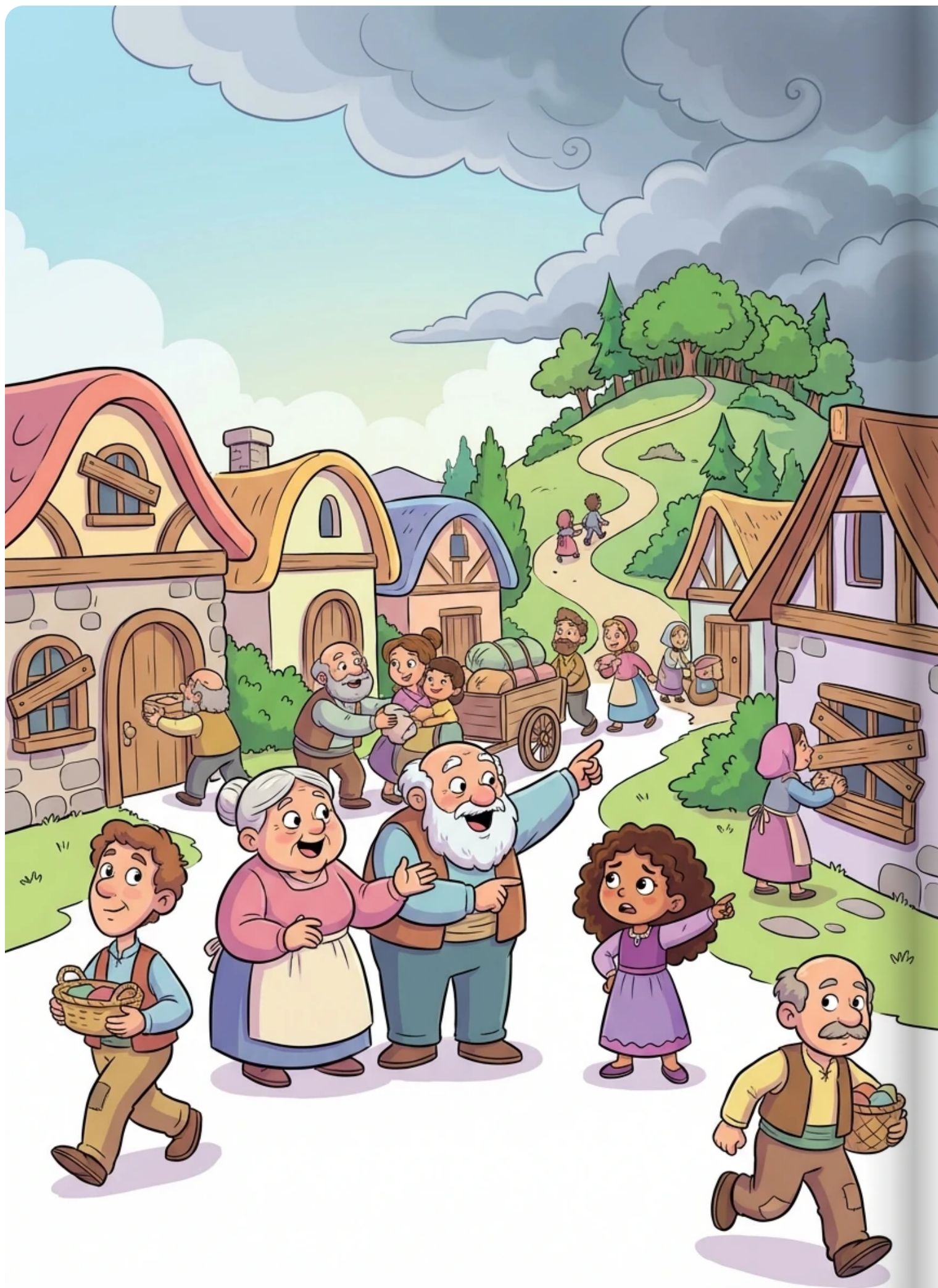
Trembling, Fatima tried to speak, but the words caught in her throat. Jaffa and Maya noticed her distress and urged her to share what she saw.



With great effort, Fatima whispered, 'Storm... coming... big storm!' Her friends, though initially skeptical, trusted Fatima's unusual gift.



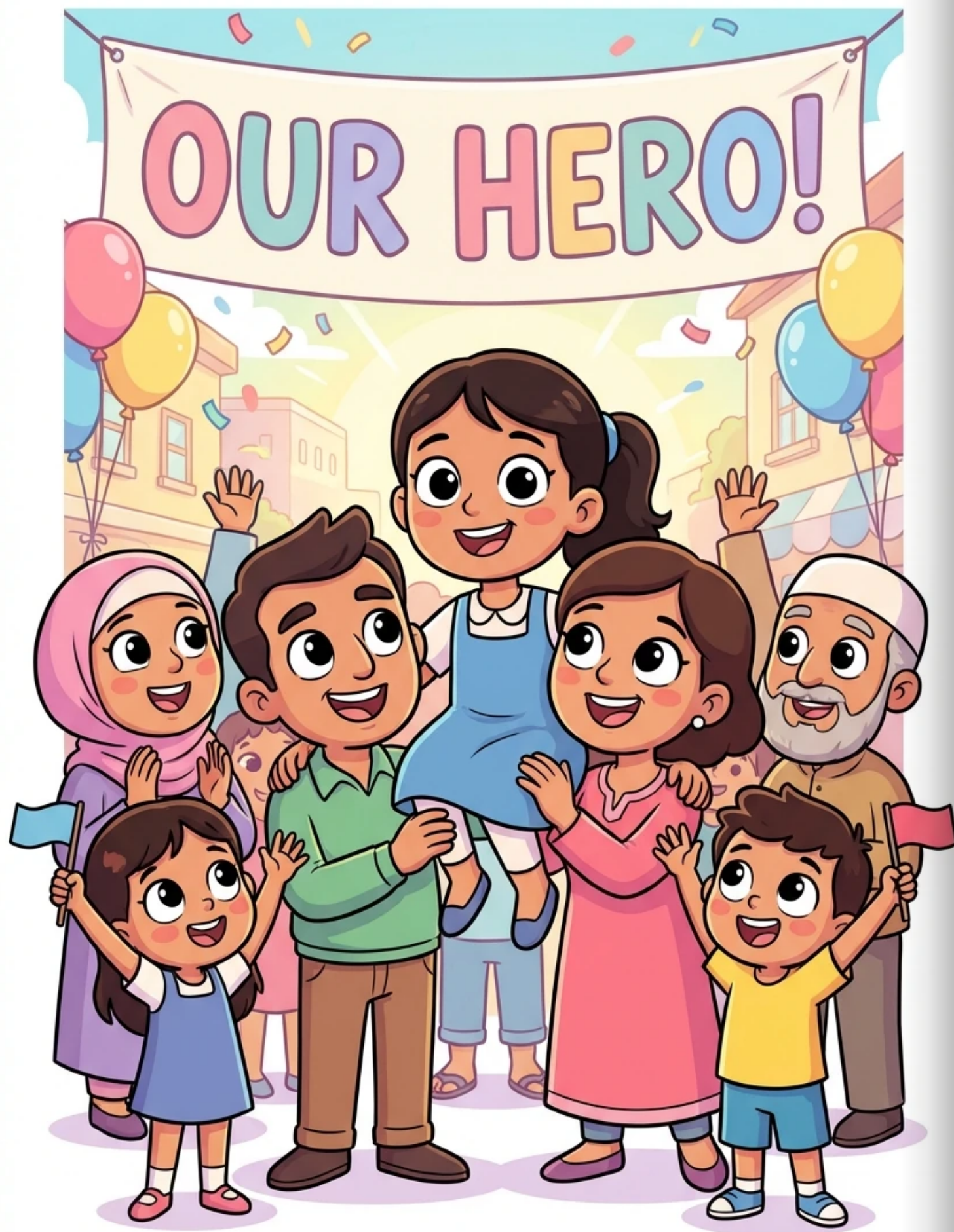
Jaffa ran to alert the village elders, while Maya helped Fatima gather her family to prepare for the impending storm.
