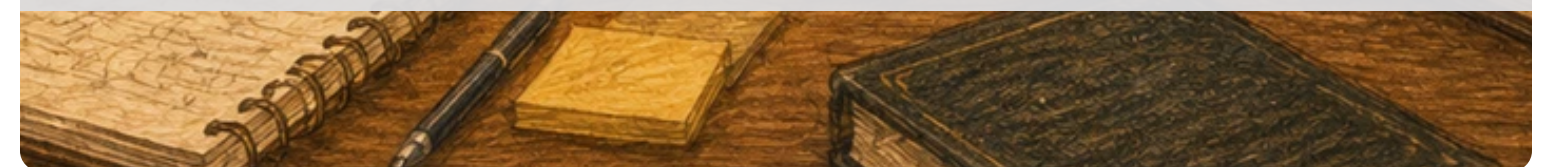




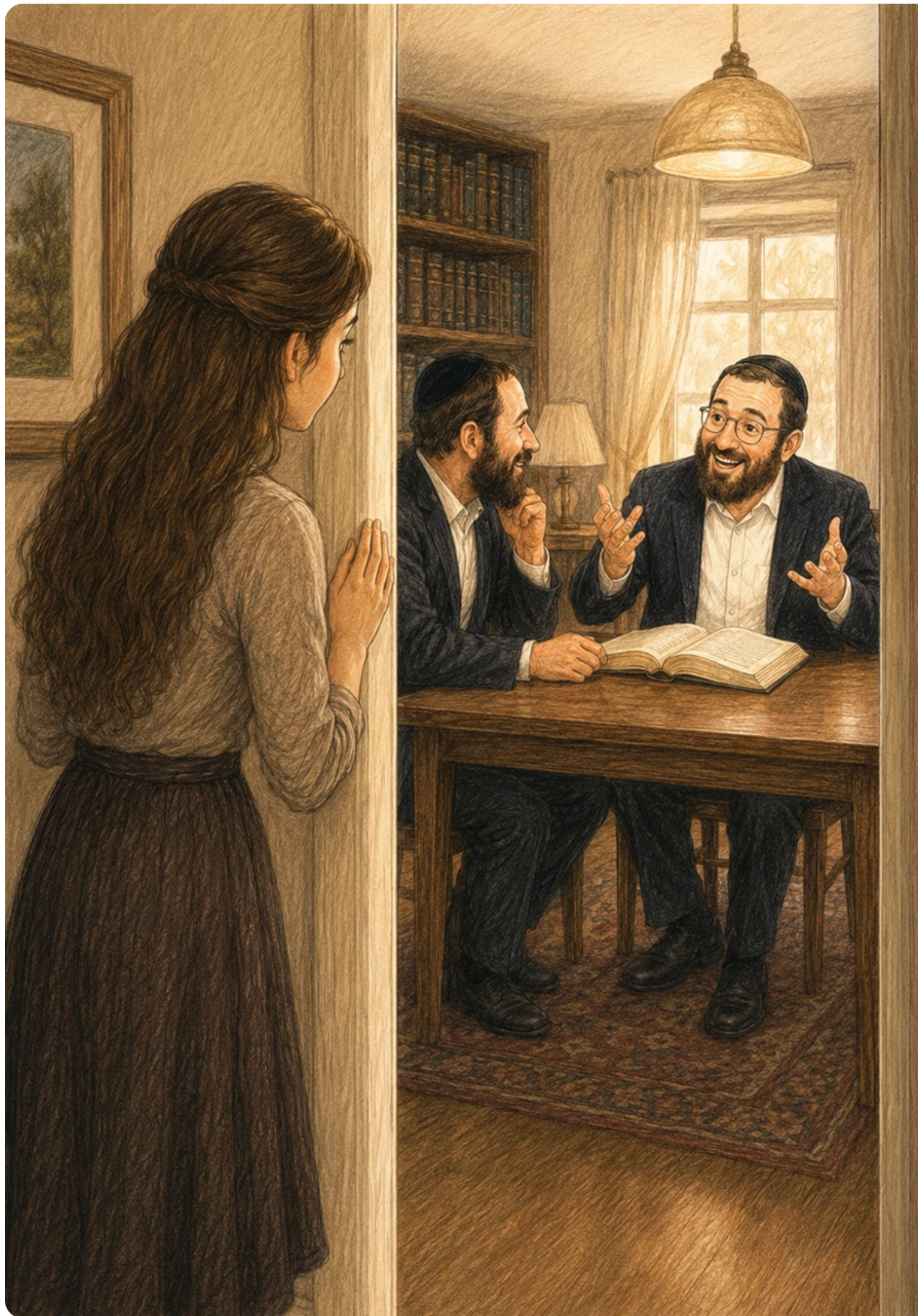
# A Guide for the s
