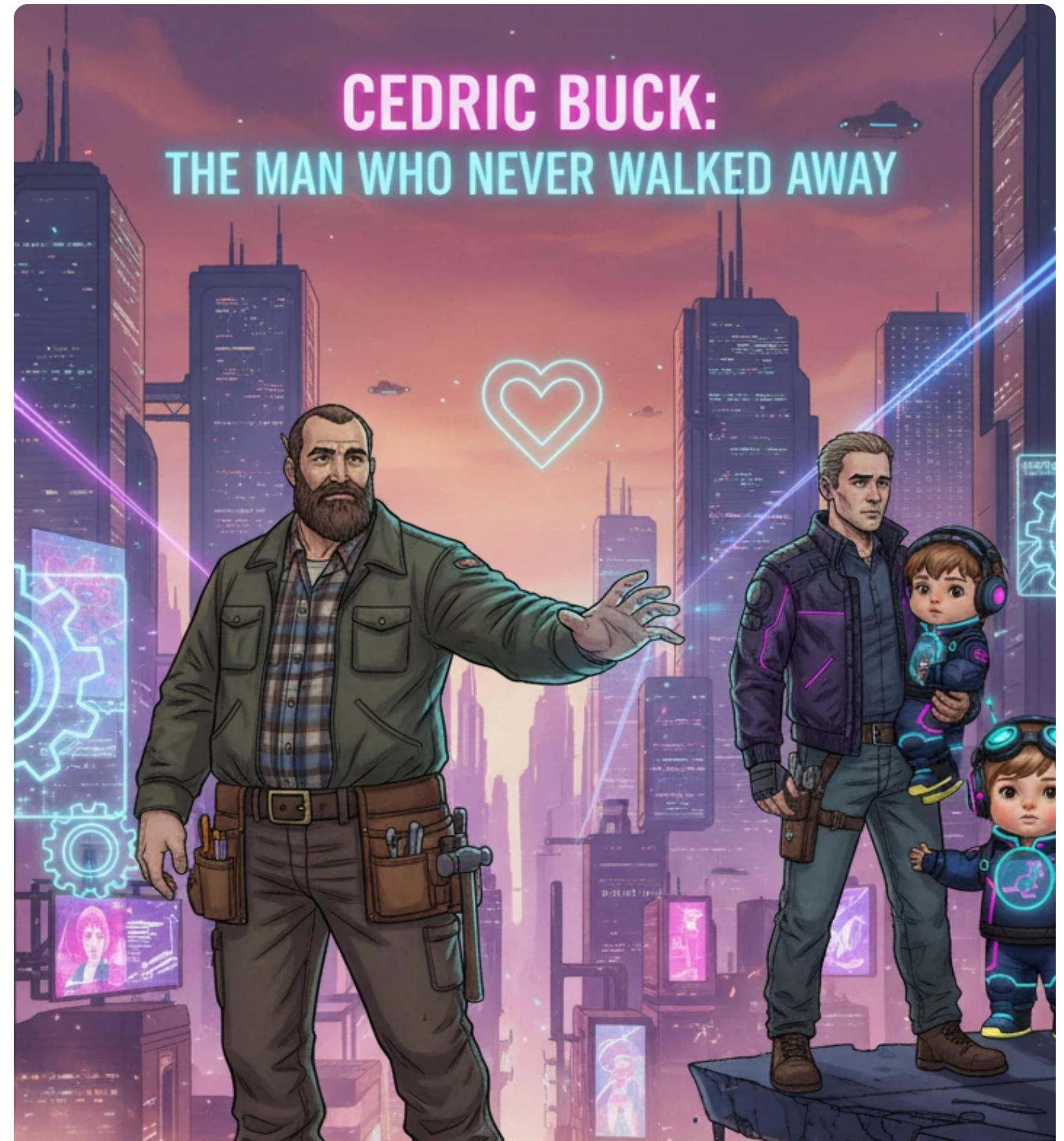


CEDRIC BUCK: THE MAN WHO NEVER WALKED AWAY
