




Okereke the Dancing Star

At the auditions, many talented dancers showcased their skills. Okereke felt a flutter of nerves, but she remembered her grandmother's words and took a deep breath.




When it was her turn, Okereke stepped onto the stage. The music started, and she began to dance. Her body moved with a fluidity and joy that captivated everyone in the audience.
