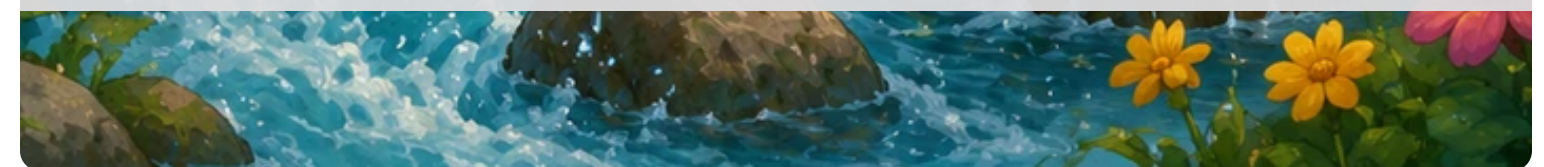




Leo and Pip: A Story of True Friendship
