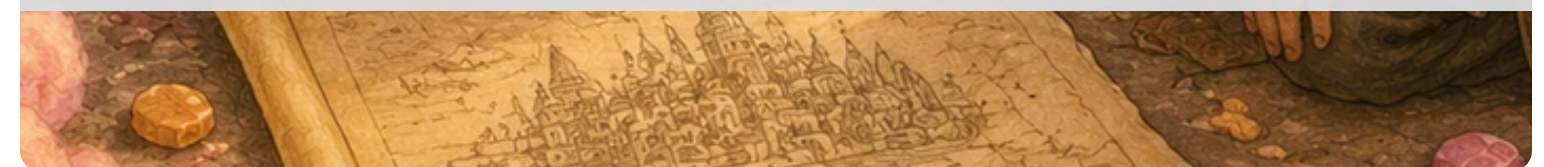




# Jana and the Secret of the Magical City
