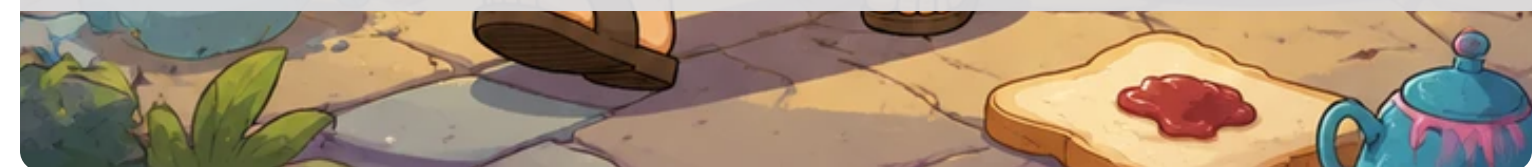




The Absurd Day in South Fridge

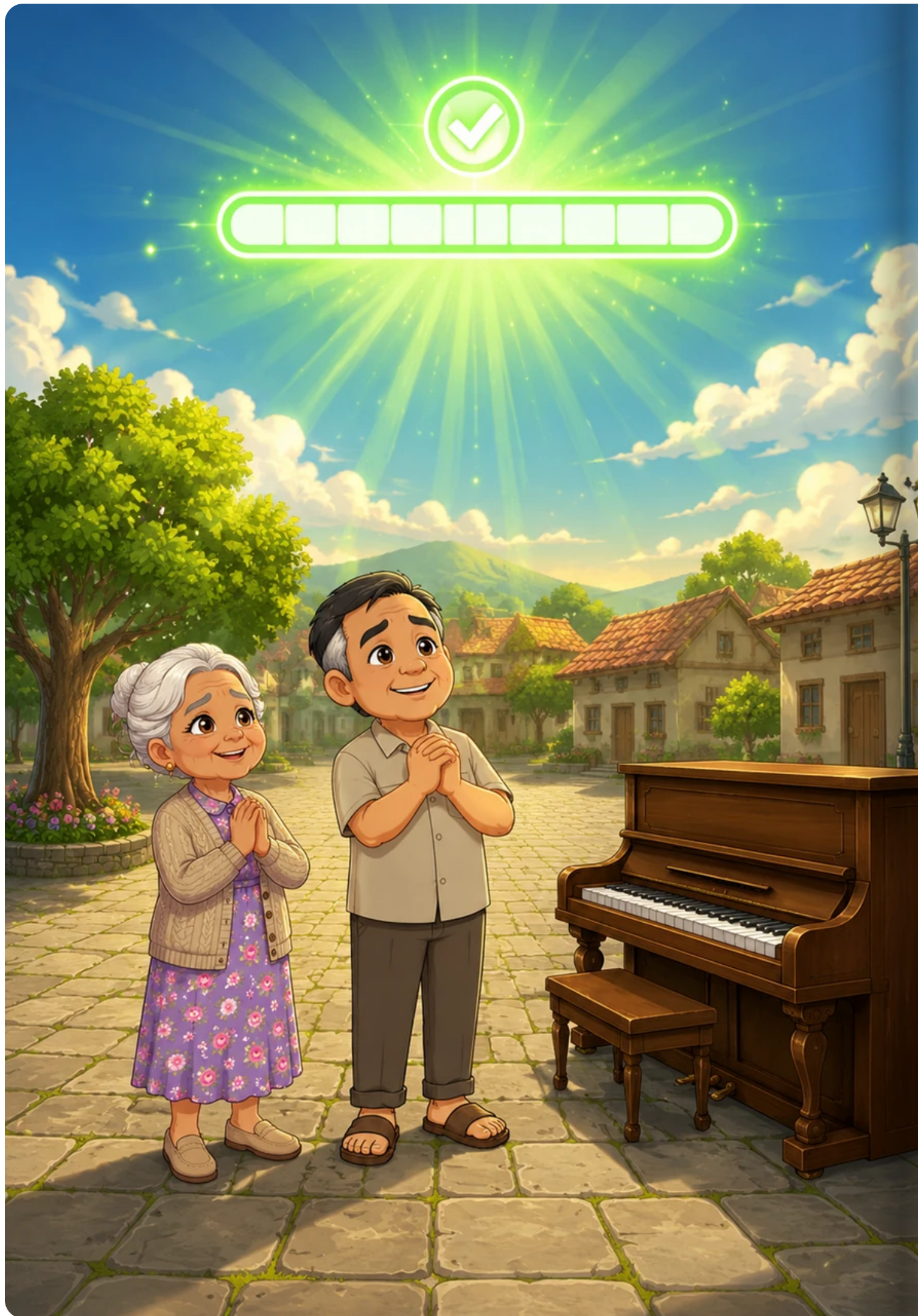
