

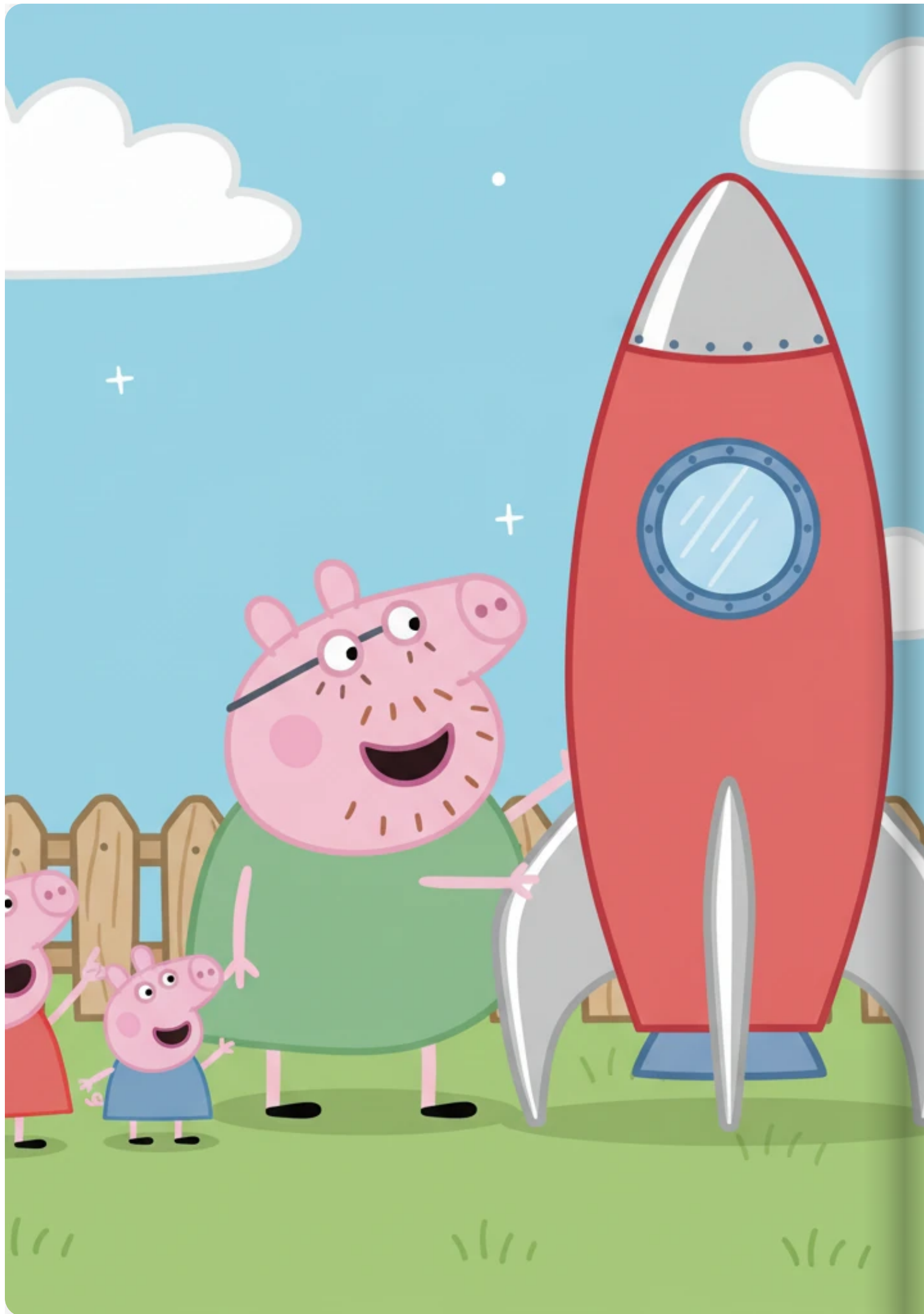


小猪佩奇的太空之旅，英文绘本

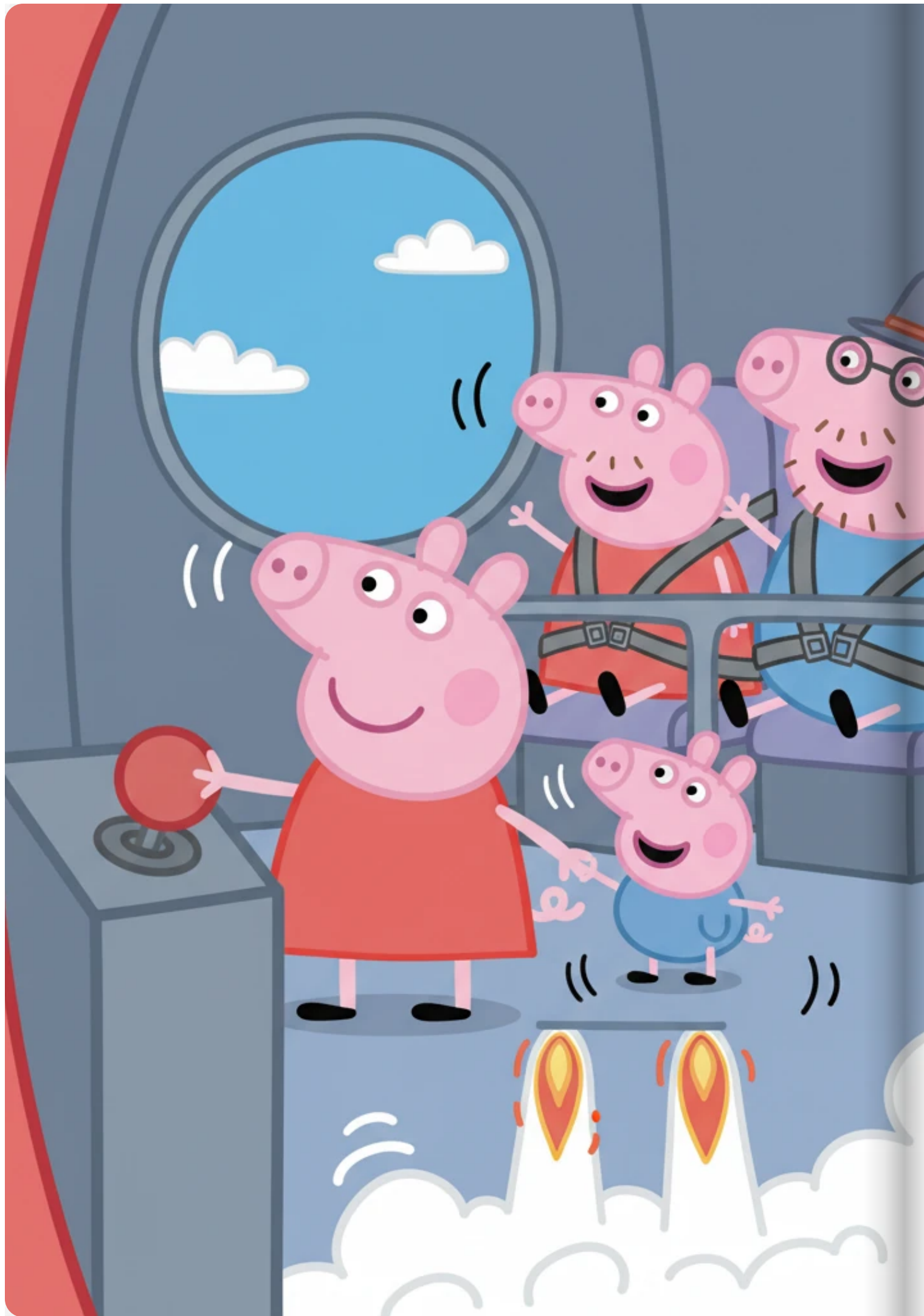

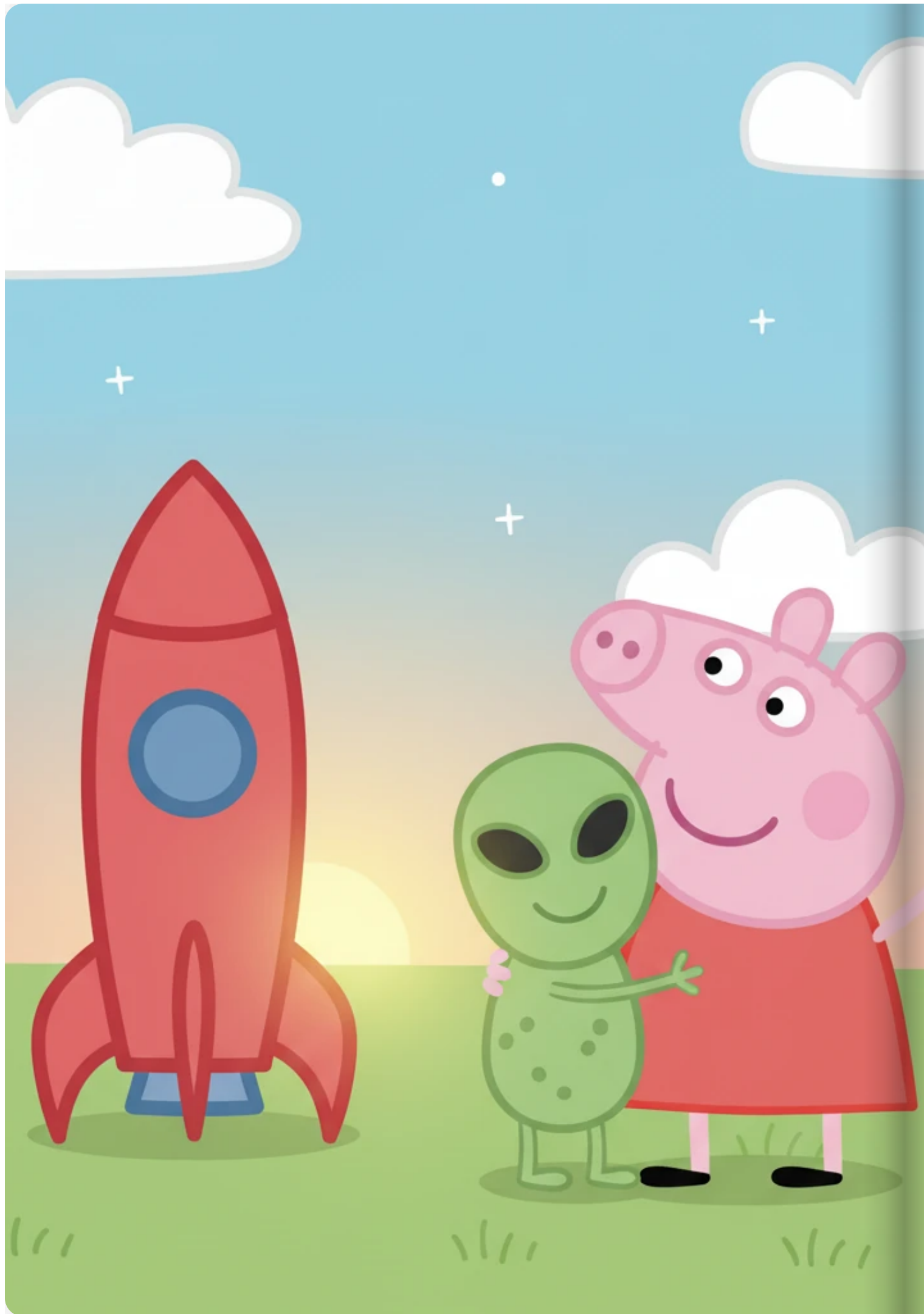
