

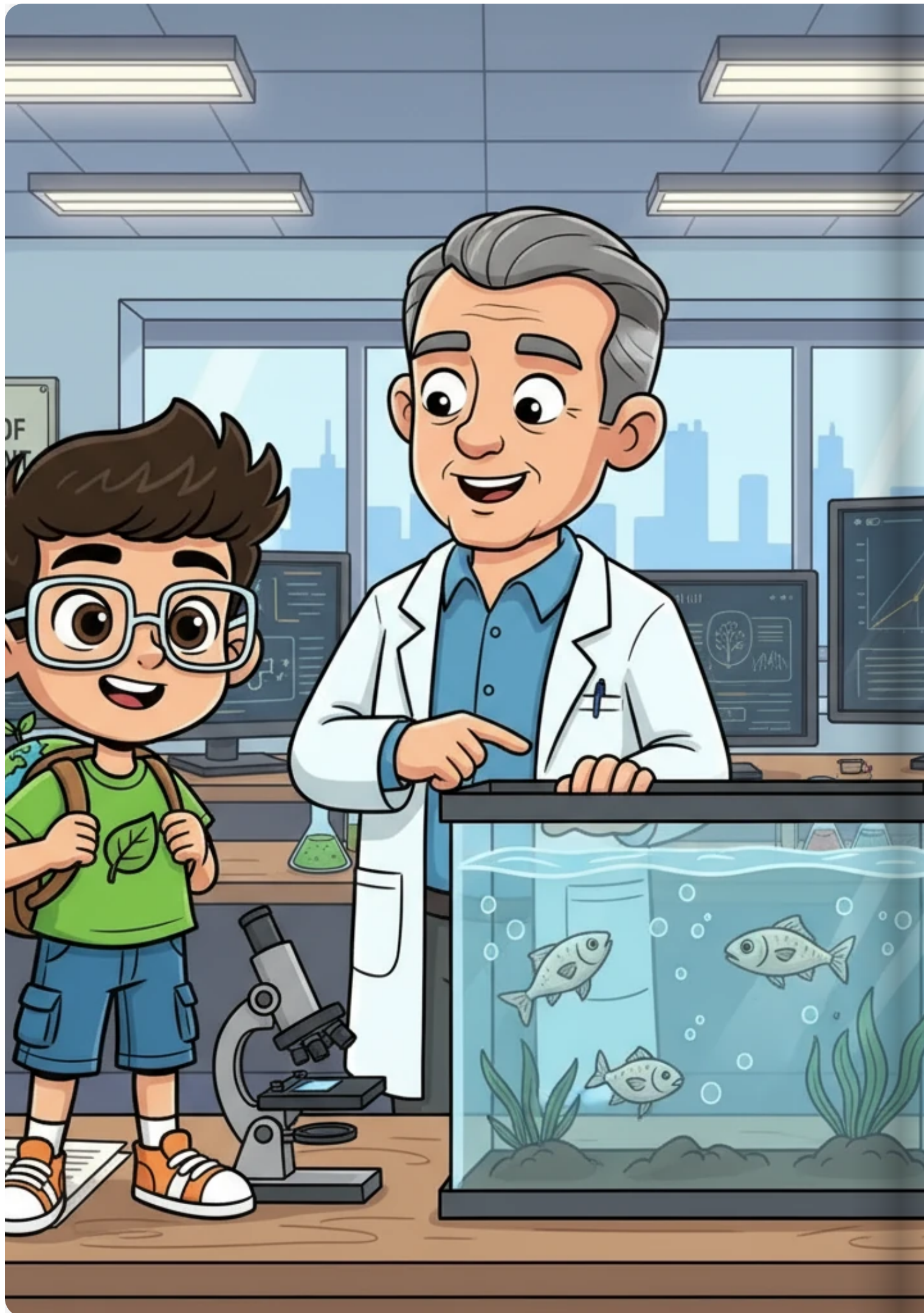


## Hamad's Green Vision

The sun beat down on the Doha Corniche as Hamad Al-Hoori's class enjoyed their field trip. But Hamad's attention was drawn to something disturbing: dead fish littered the shoreline. Troubled, he snapped photos, a seed of concern planted in his heart.
