



Leo's Big Apple Adventure

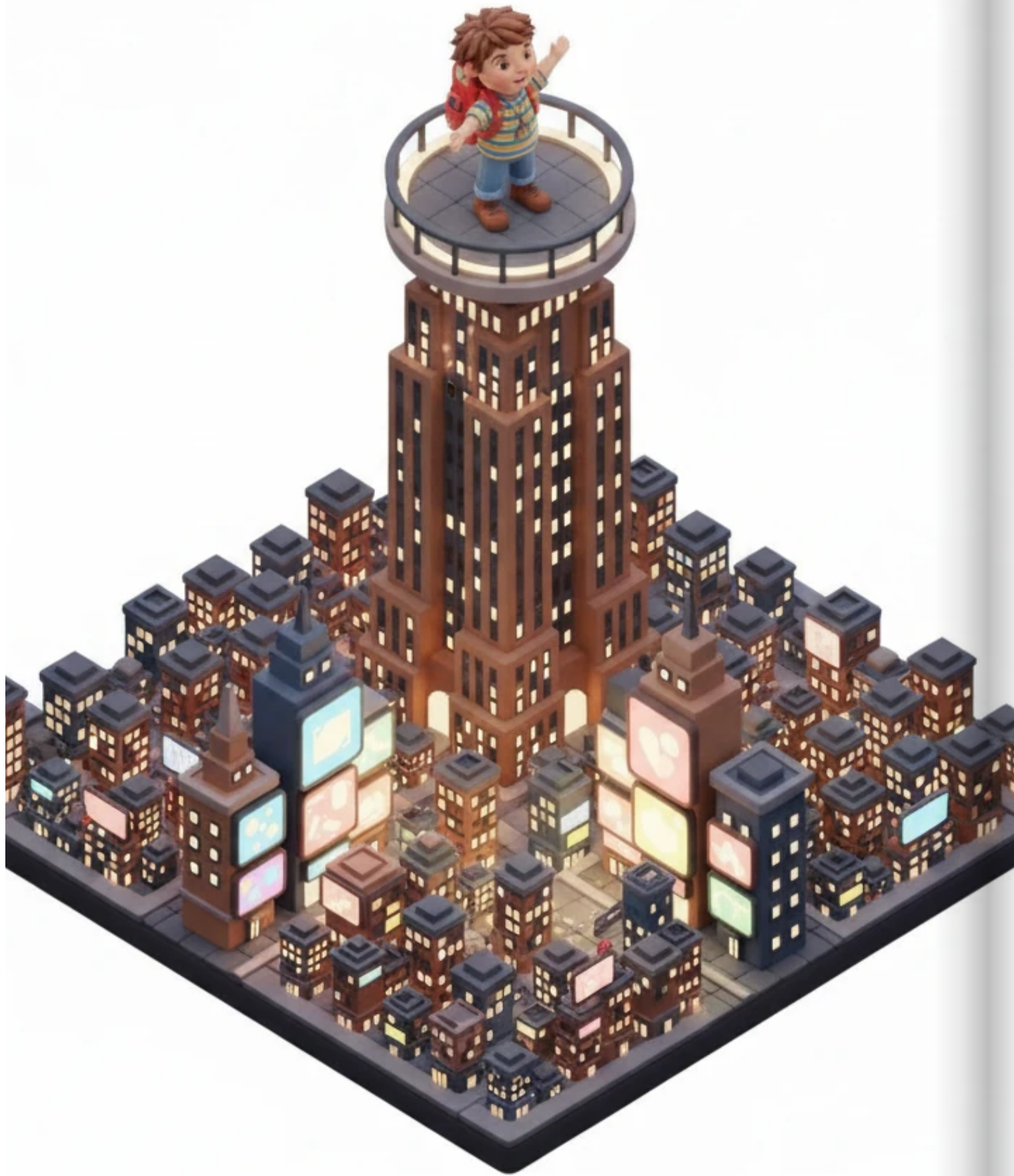
