D is for dog, digging in the sand, showing the D with his paw in hand. Hold your hand up, and make a D shape with your fingers. The dog happily digs with a paw showing the sign.



E is for elephant, ears so grand, flapping them wide across the land. Make a fist and open your fingers. The elephant flaps its ears with a joyful trunk.



F is for fox, sly and neat, touching his teeth, oh so sweet. Touch your thumb to your index finger. The fox winks, showing his cleverness.



G is for goose, honking with glee, showing the G for you and me. Extend your thumb and index finger, making a G. The goose honks proudly.



H is for horse, galloping fast, showing the H that's meant to last. Make your fingers into two parallel lines. The horse gallops with a flowing mane.



I is for iguana, basking in the sun, showing the I until the day is done. Point your pinky finger up. The iguana relaxes in the warm sunlight.
