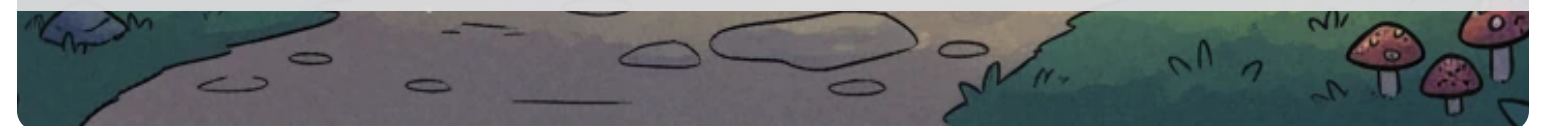




# The Whispering Woods and Elara's Song
