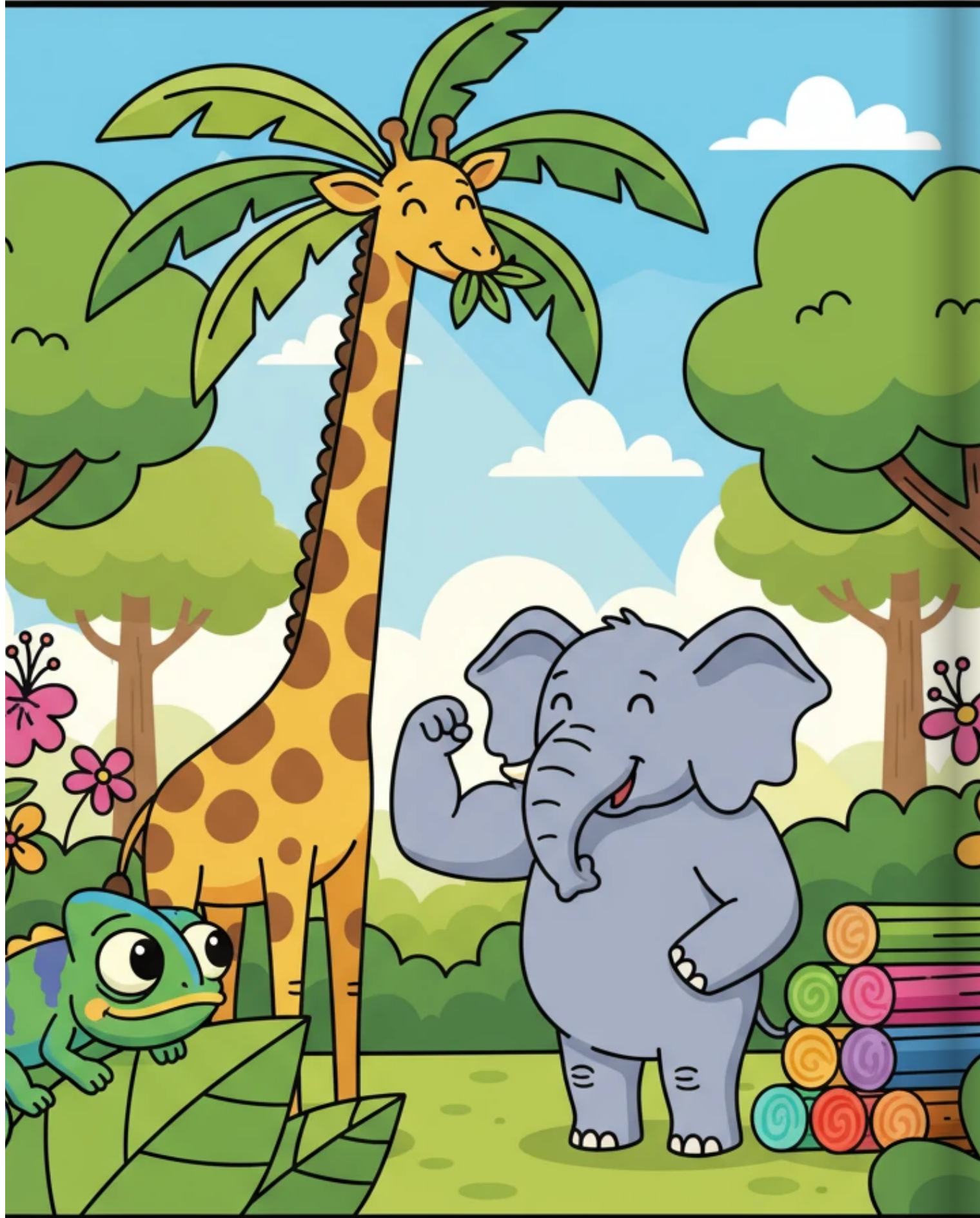




The Wonderful World of Us
