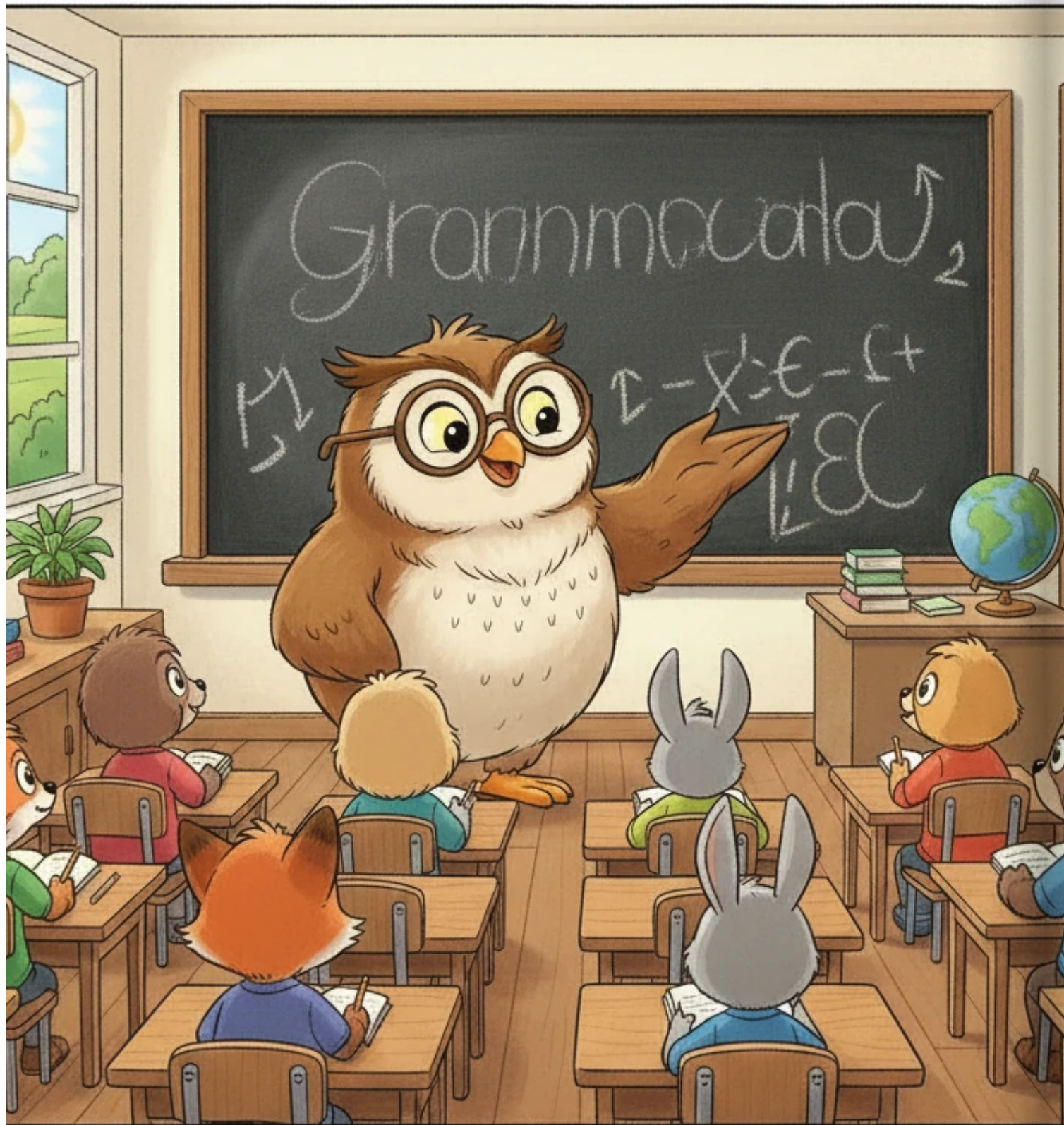


The Present Perfect Adventures of Professor Grammar
